

CAMPUS VISIT CHECKLIST

1. Does the college have adequate course offerings in your major field?
2. Does the college have adequate instructional facilities to meet your needs?
3. Do freshmen have an opportunity to take at least some of their courses with full-time college faculty as teachers?
4. What is the typical size of classes for freshmen? For upper classmen?
5. What library facilities are available on campus? How well equipped is the library in your intended field of study?
6. If you are interested in military training, are ROTC or military science programs available?
7. Are freshmen required to live in the college residence halls?
8. Is on-campus housing available for all students who want it?
9. What is your impression of campus dining facilities?
10. Is there a good snack bar or other student “eating and meeting” place on or near campus?
11. Are medical, dental and/or nursing services available on the campus?
12. How well staffed is the college to counsel you with personal problems, vocational plans, academic adjustment and choice of courses?
13. What kinds of freshman orientation programs are offered?
14. Is there a religious center of your faith on or near campus?
15. Does the institution approve or sponsor the type of religious club in which you may be interested?
16. Does the college have a social room, union or commons to serve as the center for student activities?
17. Does the college have good indoor and outdoor facilities for both intramural and intercollegiate sports? Are the sports in which you are interested offered?
18. Does the college or community offer a variety of cultural opportunities—concerts, lectures, performing artists and the like?
19. What fraternities, sororities, or clubs does the college have? What percentage of students belong to these organizations?
20. Is the campus physically accessible to students with any type of disability?
21. What supports are in place to help individuals with physical and/or mental disabilities?

22. What financial assistance is available? How does an entering freshman apply for financial aid?
23. What is the automobile policy?
24. Do the members of the faculty seem friendly and helpful in their attitudes toward and relations with students?
25. Are the students easy to relate to? Do you feel comfortable with the campus environment?
26. Are the students in general courteous and friendly to visitors?
27. Do the buildings and grounds seem to be well maintained? Do the buildings appeal to you?
28. Will travel from your home to the campus and vice versa present a problem for you?
29. Do the students of the college apparently take pride in maintaining a clean and well-ordered campus?
30. Is the campus near enough to or far enough from the local community? Does the community environment appeal to you?
31. What is the geographical make-up of the student body? Is it more or less difficult for student from your area to gain admission to this college?
32. What are the typical costs per year for students attending the college?
33. What are some of the important college regulations for all students? Are there any special regulations for freshmen?
34. Does the college provide career planning and placement services?
35. Are tutorial services available?
36. Is the college accredited by regional and state accrediting agencies?
